On the other hand, the tax collector came before God in complete humility, admitting who he really was, and went home at peace with God.

This Sunday is **World Mission Sunday**; it reminds us that we are one with the Universal Church around the world and that we are all called to commit ourselves in carrying on the mission of Christ, however different our situations may be.
